Puno is located in the south-eastern part of the country at 3,827 meters of altitude on the banks of the Titicaca Lake, which is the world's highest navigable lake connecting Peru and Bolivia with a particular beauty and full of mystery characteristic of this mythical place.

Puno was founded in 1668 and is known as the folkloric capital of Peru as well as the cradle of the Inca's legend. Puno's weather has two main seasons: rainy between December and April and dry between May and September, it is mild during the day and cold at night.

PAT 0171 - PUNO AND THE TITICACA LAKE (3 Days / 2 Nights)

Day 1: JULIACA / PUNO

Transfer to the airport to board the flight to Juliaca.

Upon arrival, transfer to Puno for lodging accommodations.

On the way, visit the archeological center of Sillustani to appreciate the pre-Incas tombs known as "Chullpas" constructed with stone in a cylindrical shape.

Day 2: TAQUILE ISLAND

Breakfast and excursion navigating over the Titicaca Lake and visit Taquile island, a beautiful place where they still maintain their ancestral form of life inherited from the Incas. Also, visit Uros floating island constructed with "totora".

Day 3: PUNO

Breakfast and transfer to the airport or to the train or bus station.

NOTE: We offer optional transfers to La Paz, by bus or crossing the Titicaca Lake.
